# NOTICE OF PARTISAN PRIMARY AND SAMPLE BALLOTS **AUGUST 9, 2022**

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#### OFFICE OF THE RACINE COUNTY CLERK TO THE VOTERS OF RACINE COUNTY:

Notice is hereby given of a partisan primary to be held in Racine County on August 9, 2022, at which the nominees for the offices named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office under the appropriate party, each in its proper column, together with the guestions submitted to a vote, if any, in the sample ballot below.

#### **Information to Voters**

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
- show an acceptable form of photo identification\*
- sign the poll book\*\*

\*If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.

\*\*If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word "exempt"

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

#### **Assistance for Voting**

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter. If a voter is unable to state their name and address, an assistant may also do so for the voter.

#### Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

- If a party preference is designated, and votes are cast for ballot candidates of another party or write-in votes are cast in another party, only votes cast in the designated party will count.
- If a party preference is not designated, and votes are cast for candidates (or write-in votes are cast) in more than one party, no votes will be counted

Within the party of their choice, the voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an electronic ballot marking device to mark an optical scan ballot, the voter shall use the tactile pad to select the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall use the tactile pad to select "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall use the tactile pad to select "no" if opposed to the question.

#### **Spoiled Ballots**

If a voter spoils an optical scan ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

#### After Voting the Ballot

After an official optical scan ballot is marked, it may be inserted in the security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter shall insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. If a central count system is used, the voter shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

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#### **NOTICE OF REFERENDUM**

#### **APRIL 5, 2022**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, at an election to be held in the City of Racine, State of Wisconsin, on Tuesday, August 9, 2022, the following question will be submitted to a vote of the people pursuant to law:

Under state law, the increase in the levy of the City of Racine for the tax to be imposed for the next fiscal year, 2023, is limited to 0.50%, based on the City's best estimate, which results in a levy of \$56,682,358. Shall the City of Racine be allowed to exceed this limit and increase the levy for the next fiscal year, 2023, for the purpose of increasing authorized sworn police personnel by 11 police officers and for the implementation of additional crime detection and prevention programs, by a total of 3.53%, based on the City's best estimate, which results in a levy of \$58,682,358 in 2023, and an additional \$150,000 per year for each fiscal year thereafter?

#### **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT AND EFFECT OF VOTE**

In Wisconsin, most of municipality's income is made up of shared revenue and other funds from the State, various fees, and property taxes. A city's income is used to pay for costs, including the maintenance of infrastructure, making payments on debt, paying salaries and benefits for city employees, and paying the other expenses of operating a city. The State determines the amount of shared revenues it provides to cities. Fees are paid by those who use certain services provided by the city. The amount of property tax that may be imposed by a city is limited by state law.

A city's property tax "levy" is the total amount of property tax payable to a city each year. By law, since 2006, Wisconsin has set levy limits for municipal governments. A "levy limit" is the maximum amount a city may implement as a property tax levy on parcels within its boundaries. Since 2011, a Wisconsin city's levy may only increase based on the amount of net new construction in the city. "Net new construction" is the assessed value new construction in the city the prior year, reduced by any demolition or destruction of buildings and other adjustments.

In 2020, and for several years before, the Mayor and the Common Council of the City of Racine authorized a total of 200 sworn police officer positions to exist within the City of Racine Police Department. However, because of state-imposed expenditure restraints, reductions in state shared revenue, and the law regarding levy limits, in 2021 the City was compelled to reduce the total authorized force of sworn police officer positions to 189. If the proposed referendum is approved by the City of Racine's electors, the total number of authorized sworn police officer positions would return to 200 for 2023. Also, the City of Racine would implement additional crime detection and prevention programs.

The City of Racine levy collected in 2022 was \$56,492,894. Unless a greater amount is approved by referendum, based upon the City's net new construction, state law would allow an increase in the City's property tax levy of an estimated 0.50% percent, or an estimated increase of \$189,464. This would result in a total allowable City levy collected in 2023 of an estimated \$56,682,358.

The referendum asks for approval to exceed the City levy limit for 2022, to be collected in 2023, by an estimated 3.53% percent, which would increase the City levy by \$2,000,000. This would result in an estimated City tax levy of \$58,682,358 collected in 2023. If the referendum is approved, the owner of a home assessed at \$100,000 would pay approximately an additional \$53 in 2023. The referendum also asks that the City tax levy be increased by an additional \$150,000 per year for each fiscal year thereafter.

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The referendum question on the election ballot will ask the City of Racine electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the referendum question as set forth above.

A "yes" vote would increase the City of Racine levy for 2022 as summarized above.

A "no" vote would not increase the City of Racine levy for 2022 as summarized above
